Chattahoochee Valley Community College (CVCC) provides all coursework for at least one degree program at the Associate Degree level. This coursework is provided through traditional in class instruction, hybrid courses, or web-based online instruction. The specific requirements for all degrees can be found in the <u>College Catalog and Student Handbook</u>, available on the website and by hard copy on campus.

Three specific associate degree programs where CVCC provides instruction for all required coursework includes the <u>Associate of Applied Science</u> degree in Medical Assisting and the <u>Associate of Science</u> and <u>Associate of Arts</u> degrees for academic transfer. The College presents transcripts of students in each of these degree programs showing all courses completed at CVCC. Additional evidence is presented in the forms of the current (<u>Spring 2013</u>) and previous two (<u>Fall 2012</u> and <u>Summer 2012</u>) semester course schedules. All schedules are available on the College's website and by hard copy on campus.

In addition, a copy of the 2012 <u>Graduation Program</u> shows additional evidence of Associate Degree graduates.
