**Narrative:**

Chattahoochee Valley Community College's (CVCC) Workforce Development (WFD) Division offers comprehensive continuing education, outreach, and service programs to support the institution's [mission](#). The WFD Division, including the Adult Education classes, served [2,152](#) students from October 1, 2010 through December 3, 2012.

**Continuing Education**

Chattahoochee Valley Community College's Workforce Development (WFD) Division meets the needs of students by offering services not provided in the traditional educational environment. In partnership with Education 2 Go, WFD offers a wide range of highly interactive courses to provide lifelong learning opportunities for healthcare professionals, classroom teachers, and individuals seeking new or upgraded skills. A course listing of more than 250 programs are offered through these online courses/programs ([Ed2Go Course Guide](#), [Gatlin Education Course Guide](#)). Many health science [courses](#) are also offered through our partnership with Boston Reed to include Phlebotomy Technician, Pharmacy Technician, and Dental Assistant. Classes and training provided is determined by requests via email, phone, class [evaluations](#), and the number of job [openings](#) in a particular field.

In addition, CVCC's WFD extends its services and other resources to businesses and industries. Specific services provided include [Sexual Harassment Training](#), [WorkKeys](#) testing and [certification](#), and [WorkKeys®](#) Profiling.

Also under the umbrella of WFD, the College's Public Safety Academy (PSA) provides [seminars](#) to foster efforts that build resiliency and preparedness in the community through both credit and non-credit programs. The PSA credit [programs](#) include Criminal Justice, Fire Science, Homeland Security, and Emergency Medical Services. Quality instruction is provided for students as well as local, flexible programming and training opportunities to meet the needs and standards required by emergency responders in the area.

**Outreach**

Chattahoochee Valley Community College's faculty, staff, and student body supports the community by participating in several outreach projects annually. Examples of specific projects in which the CVCC family contribute include the Living United-United Way fundraising project, Breast Cancer Awareness Campaign, a fundraiser for the Child Advocacy Center, and volunteer reading program for Ridgecrest Elementary School through the Phenix City Rotary Club.

[Outreach events](#) are held at the College to provide the community members with an opportunity to obtain assistance in preparation for the workforce, for entry into [college](#) and to be responsible [citizens](#).

### Service Programs

Adult Education, English as a Second Language (ESL), and Ready to Work (RTW) classes are offered at no cost to the students, to improve basic skills and enhance employability. The [Adult Education](#) classes provide academic instruction that leads to stronger literacy skills and successful completion of the GED®. ESL classes provide non-English speaking individuals with the English language skills needed to succeed in other educational/training programs and in the workplace.

Adults and dislocated workers are the target population for the [RTW program](#). This program supports the workforce development initiatives by educating and training available workers to meet the needs of business and industry. This training ensures employers will have access to a pool of applicants with documented skills critical for staffing many entry-level positions. By assessing the skills needed to perform the key job functions for a particular position, hiring employers can identify and match those skills with a person who has completed the RTW program as having demonstrated a critical level of competency and aptitude. Specifically, participants who successfully complete the RTW program receive both an [Alabama Career Readiness](#) and [Alabama Certified Worker](#) certifications.
